

Tournament Master: Lee Fleming

Are you ready to start fishing? We have two tournaments this month. First, we are having a special inter club lobster tournament on the 8th of March with the OMC and SDA (more information is on the web).

Our first club tourney is coming up. We will have our 7th annual San Diego Bay Bass with a halibut side-pot tournament on Saturday March 15, 2014. Entry fees are as usual, \$20 for club members, \$25 for non-members and juniors 15 and under fish for free. Side-pot is \$10 for the largest halibut. Tournaments and Side-pots are an all or none proposition. If one is in all fishermen on your boat must be in. Check the back pages of our annual Club Roster for the general rules. Non-members must fish with a member or have a member on your boat, and may fish only 1 tournament as a guest.

Lines in at first light and weighin between 1400-1500 (2:00-3:00 pm for you land lubbers) at the Wave on Shelter island. Boundary set by an imaginary line from tip of Zuniga Jetty to Pt. Loma Light House; you must be inshore of this line.

Annual sign-ups may be made at the next meeting, which is \$120 for the annual 9 tournaments and you save \$60. If you were an annual last year, you may sign-up for \$100. This must be done before the next tournament. We have 3 annuals already. Annual tournament enrollment will not include the March 8th interclub lobster tournament fee, nor will the lobster tournament count for sports points.

You will have a new Tournament Master this year, Rolly Lira, so be kind to him. Rolly has been a member for several years and comes to us with lots of experience. He graduated from Pt. Loma High School on a Friday and was on a purse seiner the next afternoon to Panama. He spent 16 years on a seiner and holds several USCG Masters Tickets, including 2000 Ton and 1500 Ton Towing. Rolly has worked as 2nd Captain on Polaris Supreme with Captain Tommy Rothery. He fishes with his son Roman and together they have won the Make A Wish Tuna Challenge 4 times in 4 categories. See Rolly or myself at the next meeting for the signup.

"Let's get ready to rumble!" It's time to start another fun filled fishing season. Our first tournament is our Bay Bass classic on March 15th, so sharpen your knives for this Ides of March gathering. Bring your largest bass to the Wave between 2 PM to 3 PM for a chance at first, second, or third place for men's, women's, and juniors' sports points and prizes. Don't forget to enter the Halibut side pot for the cash prize. Remember, this is a San Diego Bay tournament with the boundary at the entrance of the Bay with a line roughly drawn from the end of the Zuniga Jetty to the tip of Point Loma. The interior tip of Point Loma is part of the Cabrillo State Marine

Reserve and therefore closed to fishing. The interior Marine Reserve line runs north to south from where the North Latitude 32 degree 40.00 second line makes land fall at the east shore of Point Loma. This point is roughly a line running from the end of the Zuniga Jetty do west to the shoreline at Point Loma. Check the "Guide to the Southern California Marine Protected Areas" prepared by CDF&W.
